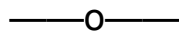


PROGRAMME OF EVENTS

10 a.m. March from the Cattle Field Entrance to the flag poles, where the President will open the Show and hoist the flag.

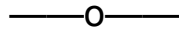

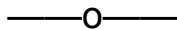
DOG AGILITY

DOMESTIC

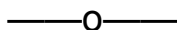

marquee closed for milking trials 7-8 a.m. and 5-6 p.m.

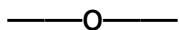

There are 63 classes in all, including the popular Horse of the Year Show qualifiers, which should again entice competitors from far and wide, helping to make the Show as exciting as ever.



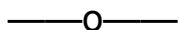
HORTICULTURE

Prizes presented at 5 p.m.

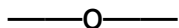


PIGEONS

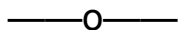


POULTRY

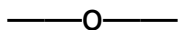

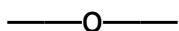
