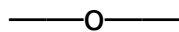


PROGRAMME OF EVENTS

10 a.m. March from the Cattle Field Entrance to the flag poles, where the President will open the Show and hoist the flag.

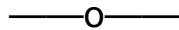

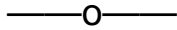


DOGS

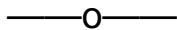
DOG AGILITY

Presentation of prizes at 4.30 p.m.

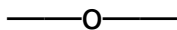


GOATS

Ringside judging starts 9.30 a.m. Dairy goats, 11 a.m. Pygmy goats.

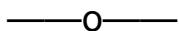

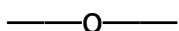
HORTICULTURE

Prizes presented at 5 p.m.

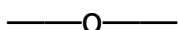


PIGEONS

Presentation of prizes at 3.30 p.m.

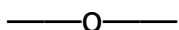


POULTRY

Presentation of prizes at 5 p.m.

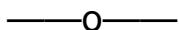

Fancy, Lop, Rex, Junior and Pets Classes, also Fur Classes.

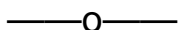
